



DRESS CODE

Shareholders and Members, along with their Guests, are required to dress in appropriate golf attire.

Shareholders and Members are responsible for informing their Guests about the Dress Code prior to arriving at the golf club. The Dress Code is in effect during all regulation and tournament play;

- No gym shorts or cut-offs are allowed. Also, t-shirts, tank tops, spaghetti strap t-shirts, halter tops, muscle shirts or half shirts. Dress shirts with sleeves removed are unacceptable.
- Golf Shorts and Golf Shirts are considered acceptable attire
- **Denim pants (blue or black jeans) or denim shorts are not allowed between April 15 and Oct. 1**
- Appropriate footwear for golf must be worn on the golf course. Golf sandals are acceptable. A “soft spike only” policy is in effect. Cowboy boots and flip-flops are two examples of inappropriate footwear.

An Important Message to All Players

If you feel the Shannon Lake Golf Club may consider your choice of dress controversial, it is best to consider another clothing selection. Those who do not comply will be refused service and/or golf course privileges until the violation is corrected. The Board of Directors has directed the Management Team to enforce the dress code.

PERSONAL ALCOHOL ON PREMISES

British Columbia liquor laws and regulations will be posted in the Clubhouse areas at the Shannon Lake Golf Club.

As the licensee, the Shannon Lake Golf Club is required to respect and enforce the BC liquor laws and regulations. The BC liquor laws and regulations prohibit our Shareholders, Members and public players from bringing their own alcohol on to the facilities at the Shannon Lake Golf Club.

Any person contravening this requirement will be asked to leave the property immediately, and will forfeit any and all fees paid.

Again, we respectfully ask that Shareholders, Members and public players refrain from putting Shannon Lake Golf Club personnel in a position where they must impose these consequences due to actions that contravene provincial liquor laws.
